At 2 years old Hailey was diagnosed with B-Cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL). Hailey became sick very suddenly and after a trip to the pediatrician for what was thought to be an infection, they were rushed to UVA Children's where she started treatment for ALL the very next day.

Hailey's diagnosis came just four days before her baby brother was born. Her doctors are happy with how she's responding to treatment and she just finished her first phase of therapy.

#### The family, including new baby brother, are at The Dreamer Apartment while Hailey continues treatment.

YDF & Be the Match Stem Cell Registry Drive: Friday, April 1



Yellow Door has partnered with Be the Match to host a Stem Cell Registry Drive in support of current and future Yellow Door patients needing a stem cell transplant. YDF currently has two families fighting pediatric leukemia and a third family with a child with aplastic anemia so witness what these families endure when hoping for a cure for their child. We want to do whatever we can to help find that cure.

This live event will be held on Friday, April 1 outside Ragged Mountain Running Shop on Elliewood Avenue in Charlottesville from 9am-3pm. The registry is open to adults aged 18-40 and involves a 5-minute, simple, self cheek swab.

This is NOT a stem cell donation, but an event to raise awareness about the need for life-saving stem cell donation and to register potential donors. If you cannot attend in person but want to register, text YDF to 61474 to receive a registry kit in the mail.

Facts about the critical need for stem cell donations not only for YDF kids, but patients across the country.

- Every 3 minutes, someone is diagnosed with a blood cancer like Leukemia. For many of these and other patients with diseases like sickle cell anemia, a marrow transplant is the only chance for a lifesaving cure.
- Every year, more than 14,000 patients are diagnosed with lifethreatening blood cancers—like leukemia and lymphoma—or other diseases for which a marrow transplant from an unrelated donor may be their only hope of a cure.

- 70% of all patients who need a transplant do not have a matched donor in their family. They depend on Be The Match Registry® to find an unrelated donor.
- Approximately 70% of transplants facilitated by the National Marrow Donor Program® are for patients diagnosed with leukemia or lymphoma.
- Every 10 minutes, someone dies from a blood cancer. That's more than six people each hour, or 148 people each day.
- More than 70 diseases can be treated & cured by an unrelated donor transplant.
- Leukemia causes more deaths than any other cancer among children and young adults under the age of 20.

## Match Your Splats Charity Workout Weekend: Orange Theory Fitness Charlottesville


