Yellow Door Recognizes Heart Health Month



February is American Heart Month. Yellow Door would like to recognize all our heart warriors. Whether a child is born with a congenital heart defect that requires immediate surgery, or an older child finds they need a heart transplant, the patient will need to be cared for in the hospital for an extended period of time. We provide a free, comfortable place to stay, convenient to the hospital for the families of these children, and a "home" for the immunocompromised patient to heal after they are discharged.

Dr. Jay Gangemi, pediatric thoracic and cardiovascular surgeon at UVA Children's, shares:

"As you can imagine, it is very stressful for the parents to have their children in the hospital, either undergoing congenital heart surgery, or receiving some type of care as a result of their congenital heart defect. Having some remote "comfort of home" relieves a lot of their anxiety.

Our congenital heart program is now a top 20 program in US News and World Report. This is a result of the phenomenal team we have put together. We consider Yellow Door a very important part of our program as it provides a warm and comforting surrounding for our parents. We cannot thank you enough for all of your involvement with our congenital heart program."
