- Approximately 1 in 285 children in the U.S. will be diagnosed with cancer before their 20th birthday.
- Each year in the U.S., an estimated 15,780 children aged 0-19 are diagnosed with cancer.


Helena wished to return "home" to Yellow Door for recovery and continued monitoring at UVA. She and dad plan to be at The Nest for another couple of months. Her wonderful grandma, Laura, is a regular visitor. We are hopeful for a full recovery.



CHLOE: Chloe and family have called the Dreamer Apartment home since early

April. She is undergoing treatment for stage 4 kidney cancer. Currently she is finishing up a 5-day chemo treatment and hoping that it doesn't cause the GI issues she's experienced with previous chemo treatments.

Chloe's treatment has been tough on her little body but she is a warrior and keeps a smile on her face.



NORA: Mom gives this update, "Nora has completed two rounds of chemotherapy and is taking an oral chemotherapy medicine twice daily. Her tumor has shrunk 10 cm since we first arrived at UVA!She's doing well but since her cancer is so rare in infants, future plans for her care are being made week by week. We don't always know what is coming next. In the meantime she is doing what normal 3 month olds do. She is babbling and LOVES to laugh and smile! She is also starting to roll onto her side!"

In Memoriam: Margie



It is with a heavy heart that we share the passing of Margie. Margie and her family moved from Honduras to the United States when it became clear Margie would require a heart transplant. They stayed with family in Arlington, VA before coming to UVA Health Children's in early April. Margie waited for close to six weeks before receiving her first heart transplant. Unfortunately that heart failed; but she received a second heart just two weeks later. However, her lungs were never able to fully recover and she passed away in late August. The family stayed in the VOGA Apartment and soon came to consider Charlottesville as home.

Margie, the eldest of three siblings, radiated a profound light within her family and those around her. Despite her short life, she possessed a remarkably beautiful soul, which shone brightly even in the face of adversity. Her kindness and grace left an indelible mark on everyone fortunate enough to know her. Margie's social worker, on numerous occasions, expressed that she was among her all-time favorite patients. As we grieve her loss, we extend our deepest condolences to her family during this difficult period. **Despite the language barrier, the emotions of grief, compassion, and love transcend linguistic boundaries, and we are hopeful they feel the love from the Yellow Door Family during this difficult time.**

Welcome Magnolia and Grace



MAGNOLIA ("MAGGIE"): Not only did we welcome Magnolia and family to Fox Hollow last month, but we are excited to wish her a very happy 2nd birthday! She received the

gift of life this year and we are hopeful her new kidney will ensure a happy and healthy year for her.

Maggie was diagnosed in utero with bilateral multi-cystic kidneys which is almost always fatal. The family was told that she would most likely only survive a few hours after birth. She defied the odds. Maggie spent five weeks in the NICU before beginning weekly dialysis treatments at seven-weeks-old. The family knew dialysis was not a cure and she would require a kidney transplant in order to survive.

That life-saving gift of a donor kidney came on August 5. Maggie is steadily making a strong recovery and the family, including five older siblings, returned home to Lynchburg earlier this week but not before her older siblings enjoyed a visit from the Free Book Bus.





GRACE: We welcomed newborn Grace, her parents, and brother Wyatt to our Rosie's Place apartment earlier this month. Before her birth, doctors knew Grace would have heart issues, but they weren't prepared for Choanal Atresia, a narrowing or blockage of the nasal passageway that results in difficulty breathing. She is undergoing surgery this week to correct that.

Grace will then require future surgery for her heart condition Tetralogy of Fallot, which is a combination of four congenital heart defects: ventricular septal defect (VSD), pulmonary stenosis, a misplaced aorta and a thickened right ventricular wall (right

ventricular hypertrophy). This combination of heart defects usually results in a lack of oxygen-rich blood reaching the body.

The family will be able to stay close by until Grace is stable enough to go home.



WYATT: Here is Wyatt, Grace's brother, who loves the pool at Stone Creek Village. His folks said he's been such a trooper with visits to the hospital, and his pool time is the way he gets his "wiggles" out.

Alex Receives a Donor Heart



You may remember Alex who we welcomed in July when Alex came to UVA for an LVAD, a device that assists the left ventricle. A heart transplant would be required for survival but Alex desperately wished to see the band, Ghost, perform in concert. UVA gave the green light and Alex was able to attend the show and then added to the transplant list.

Alex received a donor heart a week ago and remains in the hospital. Alex's dad and grandma just checked into our VOGA Apartment to be nearby during the next few critical weeks of recovery.

We are thankful Alex got to see the concert and are hopeful for a full recovery.
