

Atlas Receives his Donor Heart!

This Heart Month, we have exciting news to share: **Atlas received his life-saving heart on December 31!** After spending over 9 months in UVA Health Children's hospital on the waitlist, Atlas finally received his gift of life just in time for the new year.

Atlas's family has been staying at Fox Hollow during this challenging time. Early in his journey, Atlas faced complications that made a heart transplant seem out of reach. Thanks to the expertise and dedication of his medical team, those issues were resolved, paving the way for his successful transplant. **Atlas is now on the road to recovery, and once he's strong enough, he will rejoin his family at Fox Hollow** to continue healing before finally heading home.

Since opening our doors, Yellow Door has hosted 33 heart transplant families and 17 families whose children required heart surgery. Every family has a story of resilience, hope, and gratitude for their heart donor. This February, as we wear red and reflect on the importance of heart health, we send our heartfelt wishes to Atlas and all the children and families who inspire us every day. **We look forward to the day Atlas's family can finally be together under the same roof,** celebrating a new chapter filled with hope and healing.
